Experience the magic and intrigue of the past at Amberley. A fascinating 36 acre site with a variety of undercover displays and exhibits. Set within the South Downs area of outstanding natural beauty, Amberley is a fabulous day out for everyone.

Vintage fun

Take a free nostalgic trip around the site on a vintage bus or narrow gauge railway. Get up close to a range of interesting vehicles such as steam engines, buses, fire engines and more.

Technology to rural crafts

The Connected Earth telecommunications exhibition

and electricity hall feature some wonderful exhibits and amazing interactive displays.

Age-old skills are kept alive by resident craftspeople and volunteers who all work to traditional methods. The woodturners, wheelwrights, print workshop, blacksmith, potters and broom maker, to name just a few of the craft-people, are all happy to talk to visitors about their skills and experiences.

Learn about past technologies by visiting the municipal engine house, engineering machine shop or village garage, or chat to the bus or train volunteers about vintage transport.

Historic buildings

The Museum is home to a unique collection of listed buildings and scheduled ancient monuments, many rescued from around Sussex, which represent life in the area. The Fairmile cafe, Arundel gin building, Hove ticket office, kilns, quarry buildings and wheelwrights' shop, to name but a few, all have a story to tell...

Amberley is situated in an enviable location with numerous nature trails and outstanding wildlife including rare flowers, such as orchids. The striking cliffs and beauty of the South Downs setting provides a perfect opportunity for a relaxing picnic.
